Note to Students:

- ✓ Accepting an EAE offer is a **commitment**. You will be admitted to the Institution and course as long as you meet the eligibility criteria and minimum entry requirements. You will not be allowed to participate in the annual JIE (Joint Intake Exercise) which takes place after release of N level results.

Exception: [Extracted from MOE EAE ITE FAQs]

I have accepted an Institute of Technical Education Early Admission Exercise (ITE EAE) offer, and qualified for the Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP) or Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP). Can I apply for the DPP or PFP and retain my ITE EAE place?

Answer:

If you have an Institute of Technical Education Early Admission Exercise (ITE EAE) confirmed offer for a Nitec course and qualified for the Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP) or Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP) after the release of the GCE N- or O-Level examination results, you may apply for the DPP or PFP.

Students who receive a DPP offer will be required to decide between the DPP or ITE EAE offer. Students who do not decide by the stipulated deadline will be deemed to have accepted their DPP offer and their ITE EAE offer will be released.

As applications to the PFP open in January, students with confirmed ITE EAE offers may progress to ITE first before applying for PFP when applications open. Students who subsequently receive a PFP offer may withdraw from their ITE EAE course.
